Paste-ready lines to recommend Wedding Player

Drop any of these straight into a couple's booking email. Each one is honest about how the app works: **free to download, a one-time unlock for their own wedding, and fully offline on the day.** Pick the tone that suits you.

WARM AND SHORT

For your ceremony music, take a look at Wedding Player. It is built to play your chosen songs cleanly on the day, so the walk in, the signing, and the walk out each start on cue and fade out smoothly instead of being cut off or left to run on. It is free to download, it works fully offline, and you pay a one-time unlock for your own wedding, with no subscription.

PRACTICAL, THE WHO-RUNS-THE-MUSIC ANGLE

One thing worth sorting early is who runs your ceremony music on the day. An app called Wedding Player is made for exactly this: you load your songs in advance, each one sits behind a single button, and whoever is helping simply taps to start and taps to fade. It runs offline, so signal is never a problem. It is free to download, with a one-time unlock for your own wedding and no subscription.

ONE-LINER, FOR A PS OR A QUICK MENTION

If you are choosing your own ceremony music, Wedding Player is worth a look: free to download, fully offline, and a one-time unlock for your own wedding. It keeps every song starting on cue and fading cleanly on the day.

Tip: paste one in as it is, or swap in the couple's names and the songs they have chosen so it reads like your own note.

Why this helps them. Couples who pick their own ceremony music rarely think about who presses play, or what happens when the venue WiFi drops. Pointing them to **Wedding Player** early means it is one less thing to worry about on the day, and it costs them nothing to try. weddingplayer.app
